

The Colorado Chapter of the Wildlife Society (CCTWS) invites you to submit an abstract for oral or poster presentations at its annual meeting in Grand Junction, Colorado. This year's theme is, Boots on the Ground: Conservation and Management in Practice. We encourage the submission of abstracts that reflect the annual theme but will gladly evaluate all submissions related to wildlife ecology, management, education, and conservation.

Abstracts must be 250 words or less and include the projects objectives, and a brief description of methods, results, and conclusions. Please submit abstracts using the google form linked in the annual meeting website. Students who submit abstracts may request to be considered for the best student oral presentation and poster award. Due to time/space limitations we may not be able to accept all papers and posters submitted. Notice of decision will be made on or about January 15, 2026 via email.

Oral Presentations and Posters will be presented in-person in Grand Junction. Each oral presentation will be allotted 15 minutes, with roughly 12 minutes for the presentation and three minutes for questions. We highly encourage oral presenters to submit slides in PDF format to ensure correct formatting. Those presenting posters will need to bring a printed version of their poster to the conference. All presenters must register and pay the appropriate meeting registration fee. Registration information will be posted on the CCTWS meeting website.
